**Supernatural Seed
Abundant Harvest
*If You Sow It; God Will Grow It***

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Genesis 8:22 “While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease.”

These laws are perpetual. They will never end. Whenever there is seed planted, there will be a harvest.

We as Christians who understand this principle can always expect the harvest from our seed.

2 Corinthians 9:10 “Now he that ministereth seed to the sower both minister bread for your food, and multiply your seed sown, and increase the fruits of your righteousness;)”

God will also increase your gift of giving. You cannot buy the things of God, but when you give out of the right heart, He will multiply your gift and funs.

2 Corinthians 9:15 “Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.”

Mark 4:14 “The sower soweth the word.”

Not everyone will produce one hundred fold, but some hearts will. It depends on your heart. There are some blessings now! “On earth as it is in heaven.”

Mark 4:26-28 “²⁶And he said, So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground; ²⁷And should sleep, and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up, he knoweth not how. ²⁸For the earth bringeth forth fruit of herself; first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear.”

Mark 4:28 (NLT) “The earth produces the crops on its own. First a leaf blade pushes through, then the heads of wheat are formed, and finally the grain ripens.”

Mark 4:28 (Message) “²⁶⁻²⁹Then Jesus said, “God’s kingdom is like seed thrown on a field by a man who then goes to bed and forgets about it. The seed sprouts and grows—he has no idea how it happens. The earth does it all without his help: first a green stem of grass, then a bud, then the ripened grain. When the grain is fully formed, he reaps—harvest time!”

Mark 4:28 (Amplified) “The earth produces [acting] by itself--first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear.”

If you do not grow weary, it will grow in due session. Maybe later in your life you will reap your harvest, or in your children’s lives, but this is a principle.

“If you do sow it, God will grow it!”

Your worry and frustration will put your harvest on hold.

Haggai was a prophet with the message for God’s people to put God first. The Israelites had built the foundation for temple but had laid out nothing else for eighteen years. Weeds and brush had grown over the foundation and the people had forgotten about building the temple.

Haggai 2:1-4 “¹In the seventh month, in the one and twentieth day of the month, came the word of the LORD by the prophet Haggai, saying, ²Speak now to

Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Josedech, the high priest, and to the residue of the people, saying, ³Who is left among you that saw this house in her first glory? and how do ye see it now? is it not in your eyes in comparison of it as nothing? ⁴Yet now be strong, O Zerubbabel, saith the LORD; and be strong, O Joshua, son of Josedech, the high priest; and be strong, all ye people of the land, saith the LORD, and work: for I am with you, saith the LORD of hosts:”

God will work where this is peace and harmony. Be strong in the Lord and work! God is with you in your seeding.

Haggai 2:5-7 “⁵According to the word that I covenanted with you when ye came out of Egypt, so my spirit remaineth among you: fear ye not. ⁶For thus saith the LORD of hosts; Yet once, it is a little while, and I will shake the heavens, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry land; ⁷And I will shake all nations, and the desire of all nations shall come: and I will fill this house with glory, saith the LORD of hosts.”

Haggai 2:5-7 (NLT) “⁵ My Spirit remains among you, just as I promised when you came out of Egypt. So do not be afraid.’ ⁶ “For this is what the LORD of Heaven’s Armies says: In just a little while I will again shake the heavens and the earth, the oceans and the dry land. ⁷ I will shake all the nations, and the treasures of all the nations will be brought to this Temple. I will fill this place with glory, says the LORD of Heaven’s Armies.”

Haggai 2:5-7 (Message) “⁴⁻⁵”So get to work, Zerubbabel!”—God is speaking.

”Get to work, Joshua son of Jehozadak—high priest!”

”Get to work, all you people!”—God is speaking.

”Yes, get to work! For I am with you.’ The God-of-the-Angel-Armies is speaking! ‘Put into action the word I covenanted with you when you left Egypt. I’m living and breathing among you right now. Don’t be timid. Don’t hold back.’ ⁶⁻⁷”This is what God-of-the-Angel-Armies said: ‘Before you know it, I will shake up sky and earth, ocean and fields. And I’ll shake down all the godless nations. They’ll bring bushels of wealth and I will fill this Temple with splendor.’ God-of-the-Angel-Armies says so.”

We will have BUSHELS of Wealth!

The first time that glory was ever mentioned in the Bible, it was in relations to prosperity.

Zachariah 4:6 “Then he answered and spake unto me, saying, This is the word of the LORD unto Zerubbabel, saying, Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts.”

God is looking for the willing heart that has faith in the word of God and can act on that faith.

Zachariah 4:7 “Who art thou, O great mountain? before Zerubbabel thou shalt become a plain: and he shall bring forth the headstone thereof with shoutings, crying, Grace, grace unto it.”

Zachariah 4:7 (Amplified) “For who are you, O great mountain [of human obstacles]? Before Zerubbabel [who with Joshua had led the return of the exiles from Babylon and was undertaking the rebuilding of the temple, before him] you shall become a plain [a mere molehill]! And he shall bring forth the finishing gable stone [of the new temple] with loud shoutings of the people, crying, Grace, grace to it!”

We have to overcome these obstacles and not have fear of that people might say to us. God will make these mountains as nothing for us!

Zachariah 4:10 “For who hath despised the day of small things? for they shall rejoice, and shall see the plummet in the hand of Zerubbabel with those seven; they are the eyes of the LORD, which run to and fro through the whole earth.”

1 Corinthians 1:10 (Amplified) “But I urge and entreat you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in perfect harmony and full agreement in what you say, and that there be no dissensions or factions or divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in your common understanding and in your opinions and judgments.”

For our church, we need to start to say, “The land will be paid off by March 2011!!”

If you are not in an agreement, you need to get into agreement, of the sack of it coming to pass.

2 Corinthians 9:6-7 “⁶But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. ⁷Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver.”

Your giving is not a tax received by God. It should be done out of our own heart so that you can reap a great harvest.

2 Corinthians 9:8 “And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:”
God can do this for you because of that you gave. Whatever level you sow with, you will reap with.

Those that sow, do not grow weary, God will multiply your seed!

If you sow comfortably, you are sowing sparingly. When you have to take a step of faith in your sowing, your sowing is bountiful sowing. Do not worry, the earth will do all the work to bring your seed back to you; it was created to do that.
